THE GIRLS' BRIGADE SINGAPORE AND SOUTH WEST CDC RALLY SINGAPOREANS TO FULFIL THE WISHES OF 3,000 VULNERABLE RESIDENTS

SINGAPORE, 7 JULY 2021 – 3,000 vulnerable residents will get their wishes granted in the next six weeks as part of The Girls' Brigade Friend in Deed @ South West. To kickstart the new Girls' Brigade Friend in Deed project, GBS partnered South West Community Development Council (CDC) to grant the wishes of beneficiaries under the Adopt @ South West programme. President Halimah Yacob, Guest-of-Honour and Patron of the GBS, together with Ms Low Yen Ling, Mayor of South West District, presented the gifts to three beneficiaries at the launch event held today at NTUC Health Senior Activity Centre (Taman Jurong).

The residents will be able to wish for anything within the budget of \$60 each. These range from home essentials and appliances such as electric kettles and bedsheets; to health and wellness items like mobility aids and blood pressure monitors; and school supplies and toys for the children. More details on the beneficiaries and wishes can be found in Annex A.

The Girls' Brigade Friend in Deed project was organised as part of this year's Girls' Brigade Friendship Day – which started in 2011 as an organisation-wide community service project to connect GB Girls, Officers and the public to serve the lonely, elderly, needy and those with special learning needs, through befriending and good work. The Friend in Deed project was created as the result of a revamp in the GBS' community outreach model. In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the new project will bring about a greater reach that is unconfined to the capacity of a physical setting – serving twice the number of beneficiaries from its previous undertaking. What was once a carnival event has evolved into a month-long wish fulfillment campaign, which allows GB Girls, volunteers and community partners to fill their days with meaningful deeds.

President Halimah Yacob, Patron of The Girls' Brigade Singapore, said, "I am heartened to see The Girls' Brigade rallying Singaporeans to help the vulnerable groups in society, especially during this challenging COVID-19 period. The Girls' Brigade's Friend in Deed project this year aims to provide care and emotional support to the lonely, elderly, needy and those with special learning needs. I hope The Girls' Brigade will continue their good work to serve the community."

In partnership with the South West CDC, The Girls' Brigade Friend in Deed Project will also support a new tele-befriending project, Adopt-A-Senior @ South West, to provide socioemotional support, and tackle issues of loneliness and isolation amongst the elderly. From the month of June till end of the year, more than 120 GB Girls will engage and interact with 120 seniors via telephone calls or Zoom video calls on a fortnightly basis. Beneficiaries will receive a care pack at the end of the programme.

Mayor of South West District Ms Low Yen Ling said, "During the pandemic, the levels of isolation and stress have increased for everyone, especially elderly persons. Through this befriending initiative, we aim to build and strengthen inter-generational ties as well as prevent the ills of social isolation in our society. We look forward to how these new connections will mutually benefit the young and the old. It will rejuvenate and improve the seniors' wellbeing and also offer youths the benefit of learning from the accumulated wisdom of elders. Collectively, the effort will boost our community's social resilience and bring us all closer to emerging stronger from this crisis. We invite Singaporeans to join us – whether by deed or in kind – to adopt or grant a wish of someone who needs a helping hand. Every form of support, no matter how small, will go a long way in uplifting lives in such a time as this."

Ms Sharon Liat, President of The Girls' Brigade Singapore, said, "Just like how we aspire to raise up Girls to lead with compassion; we too must show the way by stepping forward to help others in difficult times. By doing so, we hope that one day they will follow suit and learn to extend a helping hand that will benefit the community at large. We hope to evolve our Girls' Brigade Friend in Deed project to become a-sustainable, meaningful and impactful endeavour that can grow to reach more beneficiaries each year."

GBS invites all Singaporeans to take part in its adoption and delivery initiative. From 7 July to 31 July, members of the public who wish to make a commitment to adopt one or more wishes may visit the web portal <u>www.gb.org.sg</u> for more information on how to do so.

When the COVID-19 situation improves, members of the public can also choose to participate in the door-to-door delivery efforts. When it is safe and responsible to do so, timeslots will be made available for booking on the same portal, before volunteers can head down to the collection point at The Girls' Brigade Centre to pick up the allocated wishes. Due to safedistancing measures, all visitors will need to book an appointment beforehand to secure a slot to visit the Centre.
