NEW ONLINE INTERACTIVE GAME LAUNCHED TO EDUCATE YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS ABOUT PALLIATIVE CARE IN CONJUCTION WITH WORLD HOSPICE AND PALLIATIVE CARE DAY

SINGAPORE, 6 OCTOBER 2021 – Singapore Hospice Council (SHC) and South West Community Development Council (CDC) will jointly organise a virtual concert on Saturday, 9 October 2021, 2pm to commemorate the World Hospice and Palliative Care Day (WHPCD). At the virtual event, Dr Chong Poh Heng, SHC Vice-Chairman and Ms Low Yen Ling, Mayor of South West District, will launch a new online interactive game to educate youth and young adults about palliative care. The 45-minute concert will be live-streamed on SHC's Facebook at <u>www.facebook.com/singaporehospice</u>.

- WHPCD is a unified day of action to celebrate and support hospice and palliative care around the world. It is a day to honour all palliative care healthcare workers, volunteers, seriously ill patients and their families and caregivers. In addition to commemorating WHPCD, the concert aims to bring awareness about the availability and accessibility of hospice and palliative care services to the residents in South West District.
- 2. This year's theme "Leave No One Behind" is a fitting theme as SHC and SWCDC strengthen their support for patients with life-threatening illnesses and caregivers and bring the community together to honour palliative healthcare workers and all others who have contributed to improving the quality of life of their patients.
- 3. Ms Low Yen Ling, Mayor of South West District will launch SHC's first of three episodes of online game called "The Living Game". The game aims to educate youths and young adults about palliative care services and support available to journey with the terminally-ill patients and their families to live well and eventually leave well. "It's never too early to teach the young about palliative care," said Mayor Low. "For at some point of their lives, they would know someone who needs palliative care or be in a position to give care and comfort. South West CDC has long championed better support for caregivers and we are pleased to partner Singapore Hospice Council to enhance, support and better address the needs of palliative care patients, caregivers and their families. We hope the interactive



game that simulates the palliative care journey will bring meaningful insights to youths and the public about the role of palliative care and how it helps caregivers and their loved ones live and leave well."

- 4. Other highlights of the programme will include dance showcase by top 5 entries for TikTok competition and performances by local artistes singing their original composed songs.
- 5. SHC currently has 25 member organisations that are actively providing hospice and palliative care services in Singapore with seven of them serving the residents in South West District. These organisations provide palliative care services in three settings either home care, day care and/or inpatient. They are HCA Hospice Care, MWS Home Care & Hospice Care, Ng Teng Fong General Hospital, St Joseph's Home, St Luke's Hospital, Singapore Cancer Society and Tzu Chi Foundation.
- 6. This is not the first time SHC is collaborating with SWCDC. The collaboration journey began in 2018 when they organised roadshows and carnival for the residents in the district. SHC had also organised palliative care talks at Bukit Batok Library, a community event at the Westgate mall in Jurong and most recently, a virtual talk for caregivers.
- 7. From now until 30 November 2021, SHC holds an exhibition in Jurong Regional library where members of the public will get to know more about palliative care and they can help themselves to useful resource publications such as illustrated Life Books and caregiving support materials.
- 8. In the coming months, SHC and SWCDC will focus on implementing long-term programmes to strengthen support and better address the needs of the patients, caregivers and their families by making relevant resources and services available such as caregiver respite care services, financial support and caregiver empowerment and training.
- 9. Dr Chong Poh Heng, Vice-Chairman of SHC said, "Caregivers play a vital role in supporting seniors. By moving away from individual to collective caregiving, SHC hopes to continue to work alongside with South West CDC to strengthen support for caregiving."

As part of the events leading up to the World Hospice and Palliative Care Day 2021, Han's Union is sponsoring by contributing plant-based rice bento meals made healthier by Alchemy Fibre[™] and Soapsdaily is partially sponsoring environmental-friendly soap. About 420 patients and healthcare workers of SHC's member organisations located in South West District will benefit from these gifting.

About "The Living Game"

This interactive story game is designed based on mapping out the journey of a youth as a patient, a loving daughter as a caregiver and a dedicated volunteer in palliative care where they will need to make key decisions as one selects the game scenarios and learns about the various outcomes. The purpose of this role-play game is to educate youths and young adults aged 18 to 35 years about living well and how they can learn via the game to enhance their understanding about palliative care and to support those who they loved, to live well and eventually leave well. The game will be available at https://game.singaporehospice.org.sg after the launch on 9 October.

Quote from a young adult during game trial test:

"Before the game, I had the perception that palliative care is applicable only to the old. I could not see the correlation between palliative care and a young person. However, as I ventured into the game and the story builds up, I was able to understand how important it is to be aware about having the conversations, the care options and seeking the right support. Overall the game has provided an overview about the care options while I learn on-the-go."
