SUSTAINABLE SOUTH WEST

Have you thought about the impact of reusing and recycling on the environment? Every small action counts towards saving carbon buildup and contributes to a significant positive impact over time.

Clean Up @ South West encourages recycling as part of sustainable living.

Since 2006, the CDC has worked with National Environment Agency (NEA), Grassroots Organisations (GROs) community and corporate partners as well as schools, to collect close to 1,000 tonnes of recyclables, saving about 17,000 trees.



Young Technopreneur Challenge ►



Our youths are the agents of change for the future and to drive sustainability changes in the community.

The Young Technopreneur Challenge aims to inspire youths to take ownership of the environment and active steps to tackle climate issues in innovative ways across STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) fields.

The top three teams get job shadowing opportunities at HP Inc. to gain exposure to the real-life working environment. The winning team also receives \$3,000 to further develop their ideas.

Adopt @ South West

Adopt @ South West aims to uplift and enrich the lives of vulnerable residents through a many helping hands approach in three core areas, namely Social Support and Wellness, Home Care and Maintenance, as well as Education and Enrichment. We work closely with partners on various programmes:

 Provide socio-emotional support to seniors via tele-befriending.
- **Grant-A-Wish @ South West:**Fulfil the wishes of vulnerable seniors and children in the district
- Home Refresh @ South West:
 Uplifts the wellbeing of residents
 by refreshing their homes through decluttering, cleaning and painting, as well as gifting of furniture

The festival offers residents a glimpse into the future of jobs in the green and care sectors through digital showcases, quizzes and hands-on demonstrations by various partners. It also offers jobseekers employment opportunities, courses and career trials.

The South West Community Job Fairs offer a diverse range of job opportunities in both PMET and non-PMET roles across the different sectors. The fairs also provide value-added services for residents such as career coaching, resume writing and setting up of email for residents who are less digitally savvy.


